Wonky Stars: Interpolations 3 pattern

Who doesn't love a star? British designer Helen Howes created the pattern and has licensed Bonnie to teach it. Participants must be willing to break away from precise, predictable piecing and have an interest in experimenting with off-kilter designs.

Stars have long been a favorite theme of quilt makers. Interpolations 3 is a pattern designed by British quilter Helen Howes, who has licensed Bonnie Dwyer to teach from it. Its wonky, off-kilter stars inspire - in fact, require - experimentation. The color choice and star shapes can be adjusted to make this celestial wall hanging your own. This is a great project for using scraps of one color family, or many. Hand-dyes, batiks, or subtle prints all work well for this project. Skill level: Confident Beginner and Beyond

Sewing machine ¼-inch foot helpful, but not required 1 ¾ yards background fabric Multiple scraps at least 5" square, either in one colorway or a variety of colors Thread to coordinate with scraps and background fabrics Rotary cutter and mat Ruler at least 8 ½" square Scissors Pins
