

Components of a Storm at Sea Block by Point Perfect Quilters

A Storm at Sea is composed of three blocks – the diamond unit, the economy block and the square in a square unit. In order to do all three blocks you will need Deb Tucker's Studio 180 Design Diamond Rects tool and Square Squared (the small one will work fine but you can use the large one if you have it). We will try to get all three finished: the Diamond Rects unit and the Economy block will be done first. If you wish to make more than one block, cut the required fabric for each one. Please have the fabric cut as described and bring along a little extra fabric in case you want to do more or need to recut something.

Please note – this is a technique class. You will make the components for a Storm at Sea block (top and middle block shown below) but it WILL NOT look like a Storm at Sea.

Supply List: (this will make one unit of each block type)

- Basic sewing supplies and sewing machine
- Diamond Rects tool & Square Squared – available at Point Perfect Quilters in the vendor mall

Cut the pieces as described in this chart

Units	Quantity	Size
Diamond Rects	2	2 ¾" x 4" background fabric
3 x 6 inches finished	1	3 ¼" x 7" color fabric for diamond
Economy Block	1	3 ½" square for center
6 inches finished	2	3 ½" squares for the first round cut once on the diagonal
	2	4 ¼" squares for the second round cut once on the diagonal
Square in a Square	1	2 ½" square for center
3 inches finished	2	2 ¾" squares cut once on the diagonal
